# **Classes**

#### 100 Tatting ~ Terry McGuffin

Tatting is quite young in the world of lacemaking. It was developed sometime around the 1850's or 1860's and gained popularity around the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Rather than using bobbins, it is made with a shuttle and one's hands.

Terry's project will be Christmas bells. Chose between 2 bell patterns, Heart of the Garden or Bella Nina. These bells will challenge the more experienced tatter without overwhelming the beginner. Kits for making the bells will be available in class and include all thread, beads, glass bell ornaments, supplies, written & graphic instructions. The material cost is \$3.00 to \$5.00 per kit.



#### 101 Beginning and Continuing Bobbin Lace ~ JoDee Kane



Torchon lace came into being when, in the 1800's, lace machines began to make inroads into the income of the lace cottage workers. Torchon lace is sometimes known as "Beggars Lace" because it was quick and cheap to produce. Today's lacemakers have refined this lace producing many varied designs to be made in coarse and also much finer threads.

JoDee Kane's Pointed Torchon Flower Project has a great new working technique that both child and adult will enjoy. She will also cover handy hints and tricks to perfecting lace skills. Complete beginners are welcome.

#### 102 Milanese Lace – All levels~ Louise Colgan

Milanese Lace is characterized by special decorative stitches that become integral features of each design. The creative nature of this type of lace makes it suitable for both traditional and contemporary interpretation. Instruction will cover all levels of Milanese techniques. Students are given the option of using colored threads to make their own unique pieces from the selected patterns. Anyone new to Milanese as well as those continuing with an existing project are welcome.

# 103 's Gravenmoer Lace or Decoder Ring in Torchon - All levels~ Marjorie Preece

Named after a region of Netherlands near Antwerp, 's Gravenmoer lace uses a special stitch called the diagonal half stitch.

We are offering a combination class with one class being a contemporary approach to the 's Gravenmoer Lace. Sampler bookmarks are available for those who have already done this lace and wish to review and those just starting with this lace will do a series of exercises. Anyone with some experience wishing to start a scarf, etc., from one of the books should be able to do so as long as you let the teacher know in advance which piece you want to start. Beginners to this kind of lace should have a copy of Marjorie's book

Those working on the decoder ring will explore the mysteries of lace color coding. The class will provide a lace motif to use as a reference tool for "decoding" the stitch colors used on working diagrams. Pattern will include basic stitches, four grounds, single thread techniques and color transitioning. The material cost is \$10 per kit.

Many of the advanced teachers at IOLI Convention 2007 felt the decoder ring was a great class for all levels and for teachers as well.

# 104 Bedfordshire Lace or Beginning Withof - All levels ~ Elizabeth Peterson



Bedfordshire Lace was developed around 1850, in response to competition from lacemaking machines. It uses plaited connections between design elements, instead of a point ground.

Withof lace is a Dutch bobbin lace characterized by elegant designs that have a distinctive depth and relief.

Elizabeth is offering a combined class in Beds and Beginning Withof lace. Those working on Beds may continue with existing projects from previous workshops as long as they notify the teacher of the project they are working on or they may choose from one of the patterns supplied by Elizabeth. Elizabeth has over 10 years experience teaching in Utah. She worked with Chris-

tine Springett, who has long been known as an expert in this lace, for many years and has received her blessing to teach it. Elizabeth has also taught the basics of Withof using a simple pattern to local guilds and is willing to share her expertise in this lace to give the students an opportunity to try this beautiful lace.


