Classes

100 Beginning and Continuing Bobbin Lace ~ Sylvia Fellows

This class is for anyone who has had the basics of lacemaking (and maybe forgotten them—we'll do a quick refresher) and done a little bit of other lace. We will be doing a thread necklace with some beads included that was designed by Ulricke Voelcker. It is a series of strips of lace that intertwine around each other...lots of repetition and very easy stitches.



Sylvia began making lace in 1985, originally learning from the books of Pamela Nottingham and Bridget Cook. In the years since then she has studied with Holly Van Sciver, Ulrike Voelker, Susan Wenzel, Gillian Dye, Lia Baumeister, Elizabeth Peterson, Debbie Beever, Susie Johnson, Kim Davis, Maria Provencher and quite a few others. In 2015 Sylvia began working Chrysanthemum Lace from Cathleen Belleville's book. Sylvia is currently designing her own Chrysanthemum Lace designs and hopefully they will be published by The Lace Museum in time for the IOLI Convention 2019. Cathleen Belleville has authorized Sylvia to teach from her book on Chrysanthemum Lace.

Sylvia has taught for several lace guilds in the Southern California, the Lace Museum in Sunnyvale, as well as at the Winter Lace Conference.

101 Milanese Lace — All levels ~ Louise Colgan



Milanese Lace is characterized by special decorative stitches that become integral features of each design. The creative nature of this type of lace makes it suitable for both traditional and contemporary interpretation.

A variety of projects will be offered to cover all levels of Milanese techniques. Students will be given the option of using colored threads to make their own unique pieces from the selected patterns.

A solid foundation in basic Bobbin Lace skills is required. Diagram-reading skills are also recommended.

102 Wire Jewellery — All levels ~ Belinda Belisle



Have you just wanted to explore a new medium—and end up with a piece of art you can wear? If so, this class is for you. You will learn a variety of techniques, including how to combine the skills of bobbin lace making and wire weaving to create a pendant you can wear. Sunday evening, no special skills or tools required—you do not need to have experience with wire lace. Complete kits containing wire, instructions, and embellishments will be available for purchase. Prices range from \$25 (copper) to \$45 (sterling silver).

Belinda Belisle has been a lacemaker for over 25 years and has been studying jewelry making and design for over 15 years. She is a fiber artist by training and applies her lace skills to jewelry making. She currently teaches jewelry making through the Osher Lifelong Learning program at California State University, Long Beach and holds private classes in her studio.

103 Bruges/Bedfordshire — All levels ~ Elizabeth Peterson



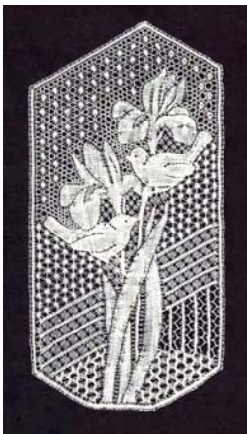
Bruges—This class will teach the basic skills for Bruges lace, including the basic tape, plaits and picots, several types of flowers, leaves and the scroll. Students will learn the traditional Belgian techniques as well as other methods to make the lace easier to tension. Continuing students will learn how to navigate the fillings and some additional Bruges techniques. This is a fun and traditional lace



to make – come learn some new tricks to add to your lacemaking skills.

Bedfordshire—This course is an introduction to the basic techniques used in this traditional English lace. Students will learn plaits, picots, 9-pin edge, trails, bouncing plaits/leaves off the trail, crossings, beginnings, endings and the basic Beds leaf. Continuing students will learn more Beds techniques; adding and discarding pairs invisibly, the Beds “kiss,” raised and rolled tallies, and magic threads hints and tips. Come learn this exciting lace and its many techniques and you’ll love leaves when you leave.

104 Binche — All levels ~ Kumiko Nakazaki (Japan)



Binche is a continuous lace with a variety of grounds and fillings. There will be a number of Binche original designs available to choose from after consultation with the teacher or patterns may be chosen from Kumiko’s book. Students preferring to work on designing Binche, should bring pencils, tracing paper, etc.

Kumiko says she arrived in Brugge in 1989, where she studied lace at the Kantcentrum. She began to teach lacemaking after completing the Teachers’ Course. Kumiko is well known for her many pattern books in both Binche and Flanders and her successful teaching of bobbin lace.

If your preference is for Flanders lace, Kumiko will gladly help you.

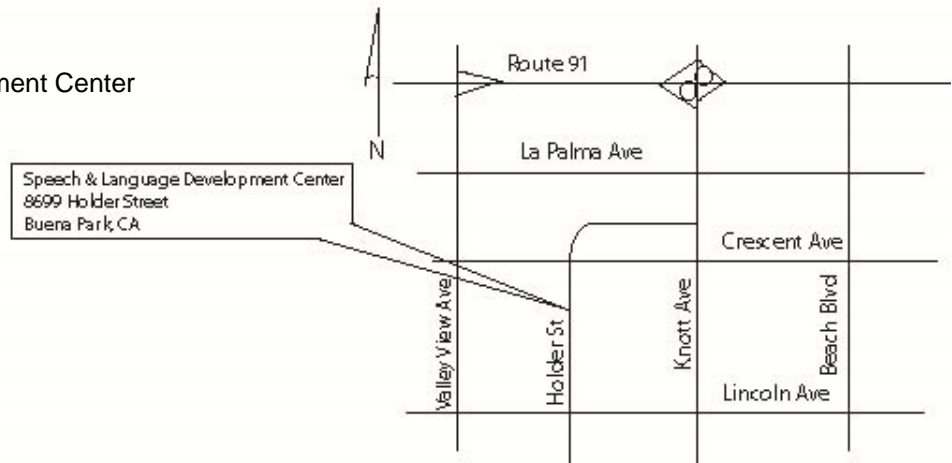
