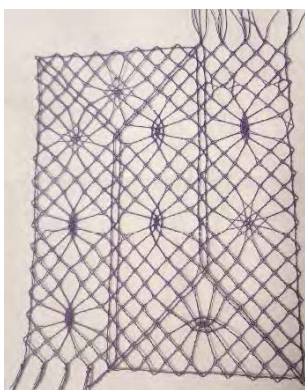

Classes

100 Lose Your Fear of Spiders

Sylvia Fellows



COURSE DESCRIPTION: This class will take you on the exploration of “spiders” you will have the opportunity to make many decorative effects of spiders, from a 4 legs, 6 legs, 8 legs or even 12 legs or more to create your spiders or as a background for your lace.

Sylvia Fellows began studying and making bobbin lace almost 40 years ago, learning originally from books by Pamela Nottingham and Bridget Cook. She has studied with many other teachers, since then and has delved into many different styles of lace. Sylvia has been teaching lacemaking for approximately 20 years and has been designing lace patterns since 2015. She has published a book of Chrysanthemum lace patterns. She teaches regularly for the two lace guilds she attends, being President of one and Vice-President of the other. Sylvia says the key to success in lace is to “make lace every day”.



101 Milanese Lace

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This class will include Milanese project options as well as UFO's from a previous Workshop with Louise. For those choosing Milanese, a variety of patterns will be provided to suit a mix of experience levels. As a free-flowing form of tape lace, Milanese is characterized by special decorative stitches, allowing for both traditional and contemporary interpretation. Lacemakers will be given the option of using colored threads to make their own unique pieces from the selected patterns. Continuing projects are also welcome including patterns Louise has designed in other bobbin lace styles. **NOTE:** A solid foundation in basic Bobbin Lace skills is required. Ability to read diagrams is also recommended.

Louise Colgan is a lacemaker, designer, and teacher with experience in a broad range of Bobbin Lace techniques. She began making lace in 1985 and has been teaching for over 30 years. Louise is an Honorary Member and Past President of

I.O.L.I., now currently serving as the Proficiency Program Chair. She has taught classes at I.O.L.I. Conventions for many years, plus workshops for U.S. members of O.I.L.I.A. Overseas events include the Australian Lace Guild's National Conference and classes for New Zealand's Bridal Lace Group. She also travels regularly to teach workshops for numerous guilds throughout the U.S. In her capacity as a lacemaker and designer, Louise has exhibited her work both locally and internationally, including as a participant in the renowned International Poppy Project. Her designs have been featured in the I.O.L.I. Bulletin and Lace Express magazine. Additionally, she has published three books of original patterns and made an instructional video on Milanese Lace through Hensel Productions.

You don't need any special skills or tools to participate – no prior experience with wire lacemaking is required. Belinda Belisle is a skilled jewelry maker with over 25 years of experience. With a background in textiles and lacemaking, she has a unique approach to jewelry design. Belinda shares her passion by teaching jewelry making through CSULB's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute and online classes. She has also taught for numerous lace guilds around the country and for I.O.L.I. Her creative and experimental approach to jewelry making has gained her a loyal following from all over the U.S.

104 Bruges & Bedfordshire Lace

This class is designed for those wishing to explore and perfect either Bedfordshire or Bruges lace. Those working on Bedfordshire lace will have an introduction to this traditional English lace. You will learn plaits, picots, 9-pin edge, trails, connecting plaits/leaves to the trail, crossings, and the basic Beds leaf. Continuing students will learn adding/discarding pairs invisibly, the Beds "kiss" and raised and rolled tallies. Beds class members may also learn how to use "œmagic treads" to end the lace invisibly so there is no "œwrong side" to their piece.

Bruges lace students will learn the basic tape, plaits and picots, several types of flowers, leaves and the scroll. Continuing students will learn how to navigate the fillings and some additional Bruges techniques. Students will be able to work at their own pace with patterns provided or bring patterns to discuss and explore possible working solutions. Both are fun and traditional laces to make – come learn some new tricks to add to your lacemaking skills

Elizabeth Peterson started making lace in 1985 and teaching in 1996. She teaches weekly and some of the laces include Torchon, Beds, Bucks, Bruges, Binche, Russian and Flanders. She has expansive experience with numerous laces but has studied Bedfordshire extensively with Christine Springett for several years. Elizabeth learned Bruges from Penny Feike and has also studied with Kumiko Nakasaki. She has won several awards for her lace at local, state, and international levels - including the IOLI contest for Technical Proficiency and Best of Show twice.
