


100 Lace Bobbins with Sylvia Fellows

These lace bobbins can be made with basic bobbin lace techniques. The pattern is from the book "Bobbin Lace" by Eeva-Liisa Kortelahti. The stitches used are plaits, cloth stitch, picots, twists, pin under 4 edge and double stitch. This motif can be used as an applique on a shirt, bag or even a cover cloth!

Sylvia Fellows began studying and making bobbin lace almost 40 years ago, learning originally from books by Pamela Nottingham and Bridget Cook. She has studied with many other teachers since then and has delved into many different styles of lace. Sylvia has been teaching lacemaking for approximately 20 years and has been designing lace patterns since 2015. She has published a book and a dvd of Chrysanthemum lace patterns. She teaches regularly for the two lace guilds she attends, being President of one and Vice President of the other. Sylvia says the key to success in lace is to "make lace" every day".

101 Milanese Lace Louise Colgan



This class will include Milanese project options as well as UFO's from a previous Workshop with Louise. For those choosing Milanese, a variety of patterns will be provided to suit a mix of experience levels. As a free-flowing form of tape lace, Milanese is characterized by special decorative stitches, allowing for both traditional and contemporary interpretation. Lacemakers will be given the option of using colored threads to make their own unique pieces from the selected patterns. Continuing projects are also welcome ~ including patterns Louise has designed in other bobbin lace styles. **NOTE:** A solid foundation in basic Bobbin Lace skills is required. The ability to read diagrams is also recommended.


Louise Colgan is a lacemaker, designer, and teacher with experience in a broad range of Bobbin Lace techniques. She began making lace in 1985 and has been teaching for over 30 years. Louise is an Honorary Member and Past President of I.O.L.I., now serving as the Proficiency Program Chair. She has taught classes at I.O.L.I. Conventions for many years, plus workshops for U.S. members of O.I.D.F.A. Overseas events include the Australian Lace Guild's National Conference and classes for New Zealand's Bridge Lace Group. She also travels regularly to teach workshops for numerous guilds throughout the U.S. In her capacity as a lacemaker and designer, Louise has exhibited her work both locally and internationally, including as a participant in the renowned International Poppy Project. Her designs have been featured in the I.O.L.I. Bulletin and Lace Express magazine. Additionally, she has published three books of original patterns and made an instructional video on MilaneLace through Hensel Productions.

102 Wire Lace Jewelry - Belinda Belisle

Belinda Belisle is a skilled jewelry maker with over 25 years of experience. With a background in textiles and lacemaking, she has a unique approach to jewelry design. Belinda shares her passion by teaching jewelry making through CSULB's Osher Lifelong Learning Institute and online classes. She has also taught for numerous lace guilds around the country and for I.O.L.I. Her creative and experimental approach to jewelry making has gained her a loyal following from all over the world. Belinda is currently serving as Vice President of IOLI.



103 Armenian Knotted Needle Lace - Jean Doig

Jean is offering Armenian Knotted Needle Lace in the round, from thimble cover to a doll hat. This class is the culmination of classes Jean has taken with various needle lace teachers. The hat pictured was designed by Ramza Saliefendic a member of Freeway Lace Guild.

The lace is made by tying knots, usually tied into the previous round of the piece creating small loops of thread onto which the next round of knots can be tied. Patterns are created by varying the length of the loops, missing loops from the previous round, adding extra loops and similar.

When used as an edging the lace can be made directly onto the hem of the fabric being edged. When a doily or freeform object (such as the birds and flowers decorating traditional headscarves) is being started a series of loops is being tied into a slip knot

which is pulled tight to complete the first round.
